

MISSION STATEMENT The people of God in West Orange were called by the Holy Spirit in 1914 to form Our Lady of Lourdes Parish, a community centered on Jesus Christ. Dear Brothers & Sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes

In the 1998 movie, *The Truman Show*, we observe the title character portrayed by Jim Carrey as the star of a drama within a drama. Carrey plays Truman Burbank for whom life on reality television began without his consent. Truman's life has been broadcast for decades for the world to see. The cameras pointed at him have been, however, so well concealed that he thinks the set is really his hometown and his home. Meanwhile, both the neighbors and his wife are dramatic actors on the studio's payroll.

Without inquiry or curiosity, Truman seems to adore his surroundings. He is conditioned to fear all bodies of water, lest he try to cross the bridge or swim or sail beyond this fictional circumference. The director exerts a hold on Truman through the cast, the props and the simulation of a natural climate. At one point, greater illumination is required on the set to which the director brings a power source greater than any known by any Hollywood director, saying, "Cue the sun." Truman's life is controlled by the geometry and the astronomy of others.

Is Truman's life, however, the intellectual property of the director or the studio? On the one hand, we see the audience cheer for his escape from the set. But, would they be willing to assist him if he were off camera? They only know how to relate to him as a character and not as a person. The same is true for his co-stars on set. To many times, Truman is misunderstood or forgotten.

In a way, Truman is waiting not simply for a rescue or a better contract. He is waiting to be born. He needs help in doing so.

In the movement – which is Catholic, Christian and humanitarian – to protect life at all stages, we are aware that life is not equivalent to property, intellectual or otherwise. In this regard, the pro-life movement is truly social in nature with millions of us also praying, cheering, and welcoming every child who might otherwise be misunderstood or forgotten.

In a 2014 sermon, Boston Archbishop Seán O'Malley wrote and spoke:

"When the value of life is compromised or diminished, all life is at risk. When we give the State the power to determine which human beings are worthy of living and which should be eliminated, what we are doing is opening a Pandora's Box that unleashes every kind of injustice and violation of human dignity. Life is precious. The transmission of life, sexuality, and marriage, which is the sanctuary of life, are all sacred. The Church's consistent life ethic contrasts with the incoherent proclamation of human rights that fails to protect life when it is most vulnerable." (Cardinal Seán P. O'Malley, Opening Mass, 2014 National Prayer Vigil for Life)

With the existence of legal abortion in New Jersey and the United States, we have become accustomed to an environment of laws, rights and privileges surrounding abortion. While pro-choice proponents may try to "cue the sun" in this environment of laws and rights, we trust that we have an even greater light in our faith and belief in the sanctity and value of life at all stages, as Pope Francis wrote in The Joy of the Gospel (*Evangelii Gaudium*):

"Among the vulnerable for whom the Church wishes to care with particular love and concern are unborn children, the most defenseless and innocent among us. [...] Frequently, attempts are made to ridicule the Church's efforts to defend the unborn. Attempts are made to present the Church's teaching as ideological, obscurantist and conservative. Yet this defense of unborn life is closely linked to the defense of each and every other human right."

While the Roe v. Wade Supreme Court decision was overturned, we continue to pray for lawmakers and government leaders to pass laws that protect the sanctity of life at all stages.


Annual Appeal Update


