Dear Brothers and Sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes,

We read in the Gospel this Palm Sunday about Jesus going into the garden of Gethsemane and doing so with Peter, James, and John by his side. These three are the inner circle to Jesus, the three closest disciples. To them, Jesus reveals certain things that he does not show to the other disciples.

For example, Peter, James, and John are the specifically brought up the mountain of the Transfiguration for the vision of Christ with Moses an Elijah.

Jesus desires their spiritual and moral support at his crisis before his arrest and passion. Peter, James, and John were told in the Garden to "watch and pray." What happened? The same thing that happens in this episode on the mountain of the Transfiguration. They were tired, exhausted. They fell asleep

I myself identify with these three apostles falling asleep at these moments because I myself was often falling asleep in class when I was in school.

I apparently come from a long ancestry DNA line of "heavy sleepers". Sleep is good, right! But, drowsiness or sleepiness is not just a physical condition. It can also be a vice and part of our human sinful condition.

And, on a positive note, wakefulness and being alert can be a virtue. Staying awake is not just about how much work you can achieve or accomplish. It is about being present and aware of God's work in your life and my life right now.

Later in Matthew, chapter 24, we read, "Stay awake for you do not know the hour when your Lord is coming" (Matthew 24:44)

I would also associate my drowsiness or sleepiness with a lack of wanting to see what God is doing in my life. I can think of moments when I've done something wrong. Maybe I hurt somebody's feelings. Maybe I lost my temper, numerous things I've done wrong, and I'm regretful over what I've done wrong. And then I think, well, I did it wrong. I "gotta" fix it. And maybe I do have some responsibility. But am I willing to see what God was showing me in what I did wrong? Because God permitted some sin to happen. Are you willing to see in your own life, what God may be working in you when something goes wrong? Because -- we all need God's mercy. God's mercy is not given to us after we change. God's mercy is not giving us as part of a business transaction, like you change and then you get some mercy. It's the other way around. God gives us the mercy in order for us to change.

The disciples are asked to stay awake, to listen to Jesus our Lord, not just on this mountain but always.

Right now they are beginning students of the law being fulfilled in Jesus Christ. They are shown this vision of Jesus not on a big screen but on a big mountain with Moses and Elijah to remind them of Jesus' divinity and strength when he is weakened physically and put to death and when they would otherwise be discouraged.

It is their final exam before being sent out into the world as messengers of the good news, messengers that his death is not the end. That in general, death is not the end.

As God the Father says from the cloud in the Transfiguration: , 'This is my beloved Son, listen to Him." (Matthew 17:5)


