Dear Brothers & Sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes,

Section 1. Peter the Apostle

In last Sunday's Gospel and this Sunday, we read about the primary place of Peter among the 12 Apostles. In the August 27 Gospel, Peter's wisdom and awareness of Jesus as Messiah is stated. Peter knows who Jesus is. It is possible the other 11 were catching on, but Peter gets there first.

This Sunday (September 3), Peter also leads the way, but in the wrong direction. Learning that Jesus as Messiah will suffer and die, Peter rebukes the Lord. It is quite possible the other apostles would have sided with Peter. They were, collectively, not ready for the Passion when it happened.

In the Bible, we are often "shown" rather than "told" what God's way is. Consider that even the great King David had many flaws which showed God's power working through human frailty. Witnessing Peter's one step forward and then two steps back, we are also shown a new way.

Section 2. The Papacy and God's Mercy

The reason Jesus established the papacy for Peter, for John Paul II, for Benedict XVI, for Francis, for every successor of Peter was not to guarantee their personal greatness or security.

Jesus tells Peter why he is giving him authority symbolized by the keys which is not PIN or code for him to conceal, but a power for him to lead others to God's mercy. Jesus said to Peter "I will give you the keys to the kingdom. Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven. Whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven. " (Matthew 16:19)

This authority is given to Peter for the forgiveness of sins so that priests – generation after generation – would follow not their own opinions but God's Word in morality and judgement.

Is my life and my opinion always in perfect synchronicity with God? No, for this reason, I am called to pray, to reflect on God's Word, Church 2 teaching and tradition and go to confession myself, to confess my sins.

I need the teaching authority of the Church so that I can continue to learn how God's mercy applies to my life and those of others. As a priest, I do not absolve a sinner on my own but by Christ's authority given to the Church.

Nevertheless, every penitent in confession can trust that the priest never speaks about their sins to anyone. The priest has this authority. What happens in the confessional does not even "stay" in the confessional. Rather, these sins "are put to death" in the confessional. The penitent walks free without probation.

Section 3. Confession and God's Mercy

The normal way that we receive mercy and absolution for our sins, as Catholics is to go to confession, which I admit, is a sacrament that has fallen on hard times. You may think this has less relevance these days.

But confession – Penance and Reconciliation -- has continued relevance in 2023. These days, when we fall or fail, we easily think that the only way to recover from our failing or our failure from sin is to prove ourselves by doing something excellent, equally good to make up for what was bad. I.e., we are performance focused, achievement oriented.

But that's not the gospel. When Jesus urges us to be perfect, to be virtuous, He's not asking us to just rack up more successes, or more successful goals to make up for all the penalties committed. Those are sports rules – they are not the rules of salvation. Peter even gives into this foolish pride. Peter thinks this way.

Section 4. Objections to Confession

There are objections to go into confession. For example, why do we object to confession? Many feel we should "**go 2 God direct**". Yes, "**go 2 God direct**" whether you repent or rejoice.

Yet, we go to confession for our sins for the same reason we go to the doctor for our health or

the dentist for our teeth, in other words to receive a 1on-1 affirmation and assurance of forgiveness. Also, confession has stricter privacy and secrecy than any doctor-patient confidentiality. You're safe in the confessional!

Another reason we might not go to Confession is because we say well, the priest is a sinner too. He's got lots of sins. Have you ever said, "The priest – the padre – is worse than I am"

It's possible that the priest is worse off than you. But that's not a reason not to go to confession. It's also not a reason not to go to the doctor. The doctor might not be in great health, but the doctor can still help you.

Section 5. The Sign of the Cross and Gospel

In church, before we hear the Gospel, we make the sign of the cross on our mind, on our lips, and on our heart.

That is, we pray that God's word will bless and strengthen us in 3 ways – in what we KNOW and LEARN (MIND), in what we SAY and are SPEAKING (LIPS), and in what we BELIEVE and are STORING UP (SOUL).

You and I, made in the image and likeness of God are not merely material. We are both body and soul.

Peter himself – in this Sunday's Gospel – through human sinfulness gets in the way of Jesus' mission. Papal infallibility does not prevent Peter or any Pope from sinning.

It is a grace from the Holy Spirit that calls the Pope and calls us to pray for the Pope that strengthens our thoughts, words, and beliefs in God's Word. God is in charge.


