3rd SUNDAY OF ADVENT - DECEMBER 17 2023





Dear Brothers and Sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes, Advent is a season that calls for heightened awareness and vigilance, a theme reflected in today's Gospel. This reminds me of a previous experience of unexpected danger on a familiar street. It was a seemingly routine day, around 2 pm, when I found myself knocked to the ground by a bicycle messenger whom I hadn't seen due to a obstructing moving van. This incident, while momentarily shocking and causing no physical injury, became a profound lesson in acknowledging the presence of others in our lives.

The encounter made me ponder the meaning of Advent beyond a passive waiting for Jesus. Jesus is already present, and we are called to recognize the significance of our interactions with others and Him. The incident served as a metaphorical collision where both the messenger and I were obstacles to each other.

Jesus manifests his presence in three ways: the historical first Coming (Bethlehem), the future Second Coming in majesty, and the ongoing third Coming in mystery. It is this mysterious aspect that deserves our attention. Pope Benedict XVI highlights that our faith is not merely informative but a call to allow God to act in our lives through his performative word.

How do I get in the way, I get in the Lord's Way? How am I an obstacle?

I am an obstacle to the Lord's way, when I am so personally offended when things go the wrong way in my life, and I make things more of a problem than they really are.

I am an obstacle when I am too discouraged by lack of results. As the saying goes, I often want to build the city of Rome in 1 day. I am impatient. And while my impatience sometimes makes me work harder, it sometimes has the opposite effect of making me indifferent, lazy and arrogant.

Being an obstacle to the Lord's way occurs when personal offense amplifies life's challenges, making them more problematic than they are. Impatience can also hinder us, as the desire for instant results can lead to indifference, laziness, or arrogance. Recognizing these obstacles is the first step to getting out of the Lord's way.

So, there are 3 comings of Jesus- but there is a fourth coming – your appearance, my appearance, our cooperation with God's grace and performance in our lives.

Jesus invites us to come to him, understanding our struggles through his own life experiences. The church serves as a place where we can engage in a personal conversation with Jesus, our confidante and trusted friend. This interaction is not confined to the church building; it is a practice we are called to incorporate into our daily lives wherever we are.

On the day of my little accident, which left me physically unscathed, I was trembling and shaking, I realized, as I brushed myself off and got up from the ground, feeling a bit embarrassed and inclined at first to keep the whole thing to myself.

Shortly thereafter, I saw some of my co-workers and my boss. Telling them what happened, I was not sure how sympathetic or concerned they would be. What ensued as, at first, a concern for me that I was fine. That was to be expected. But, then, we proceeded to discuss and share our experiences about how dangerous this particular street could be.

Jesus invites us to engage in a personal conversation, understanding our struggles through his own experiences. The church serves as a space for this dialogue, extending beyond its physical confines into our daily lives. Personal encounters, like my accident, reveal the importance of seeking support when troubled. Friends who sympathize without judgment can make a significant difference, even if they don't solve our problems. The communal aspect of prayer, both within the church and beyond, reinforces our interconnectedness.

Sharing personal experiences, as I did with my co-workers, emphasizes the significance of having people who understand and sympathize with our challenges. This support is vital, whether in marriage, parenthood, or other aspects of life. Advent reminds us that we are not alone, fostering a sense of communal prayer and mutual understanding. It encourages us to bring our fears and challenges to God, recognizing that our relationship with Him is built through honest communication.

Regarding such communication in the confessional, I assure you, the priest is not there to shake you up or to shake you down. Rather, he is there to help you to know God's mercy in your life. You might have a fear about talking to someone in your life, something difficult in your

life that you might fear bringing up. That's something to bring to prayer first to say, Lord help me to communicate this. Give me the words to say because sometimes the thing that we fear saying is exactly what we are supposed to say or talk about it truthfully, charitably, lovingly to others. Advent reminds us that we are called to watch out for Jesus, that He is already here and that we can watch for him each day.

Advent is more than a passive waiting; it is a call to vigilance, recognizing the presence of Jesus in our lives and others. The metaphorical collisions we experience can serve as opportunities for growth and learning. By identifying and overcoming personal obstacles, we can actively participate in the transformative process of Advent, fostering a deeper connection with God and those around us.


