Dear Brothers and Sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes,

The Force of Gravity (Part 1 of 3) "When I am lifted up from the earth, I will draw everyone to myself." (John 12:32)

In this Sunday's Gospel and Feast of Jesus Christ the King, the good thief on the cross was drawn and attracted to Christ, asking, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." (Luke 23:42)

In the 2013 fictional movie, *Gravity*, there is a crisis for two NASA astronauts, Ryan Stone (Sandra Bullock) and Matt Kowalski (George Clooney), which leads to an important question about how we are to be saved and how we are to pray.

Due to an explosion of shiny and sharp metal, thousands of miles from earth, the two are the sole survivors. Later, Ryan is further isolated and speaking into the radio, but it's not clear that she is audible to anyone. *Houston, we have a problem*. Ryan said to a person whom she happens to reach on a radio near Greenland:

"I'm going to die... I mean, we're all going to die. Everyone knows that. But I'm going to die today... But the thing is... I'm still scared... No one will mourn me. No one will pray for my soul. Will you mourn me [she says to the man in Greenland/Arctic Circle]? Is it too late to say a prayer? I'd say one for myself, but I have never prayed in my life... no one ever taught me how..."

Is it too late to say a prayer?

"I do not know how to pray" ...we ask others to pray for us.

Our church – our parish was founded in 1914 – not only for those who do know how to pray and those who do not know how to pray ... but also for those who do not come here – or may not yet come here – so that we can pray for them ...and, if possible, also reach out and teach them how to pray.

St. Paul reminds us that we are Temples of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit does not dwell simply in a house of brick and mortar

and redwood beams and marble, but also in you and me as a Temple. The month of November is a time to pray for those who do not know how to pray or those who know how to pray.

We might say, however, that the statement "I do not know how to pray" is itself a prayer – these were words of the disciples to Jesus saying, "Lord teach us to pray."

Our prayers have gravity and our prayers have gravity when they focus on the immediate needs of the day.

Sometimes we have a tendency – I have a tendency to do this – to pray about all the things that have not happened yet.

You know the words of Franklin Delano Roosevelt about the coming war/World War II – the only thing we have to fear is fear itself. And, sometimes the only thing we pray about is not what we fear – concretely – but the emotion of fear itself.

C.S. Lewis, a British author known for both fictional (e.g., The *Chronicles of Narnia*) and spiritual writings (e.g., *Mere Christianity*) observed this about efficacy and prayer:

"I suppose the solution lies in pointing out that the efficacy of prayer is, at any rate no more of a problem then the efficacy of all human acts. i.e. if you say "It is useless to pray because Providence already knows what is best and will certainly do it", then why is it not equally useless (and for the same reason) to try to alter the course of events in any way whatever — to ask for the salt or book your seat in a train?" (C.S. Lewis, Collected Letters, February 21, 1932, To his brother)

Our prayers have gravity and effectiveness when they "ground us" and allow us to focus on the gravity pull into today's needs, our daily bread, today's bread and how God's will might be done today in our lives.

This is the gravity-pull of prayer. On this feast of Jesus Christ the King, we recall that our Lord draws us to himself for our salvation.

In both symbol and action, the character of Ryan Stone is reaching out beyond herself, beyond her current condition. I am touching on

these as the gravity-pull of prayer (November 24), the gravity-pull of persistence (December 1), and the gravity-pull of a partnership (December 8).


