Dear Brothers and Sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes,

I write to share with you a remembrance of a remarkable Catholic saint – Father Damien of Molokai (Hawaii) – whose statue has been at the United States Capitol in Washington D.C. since 1969. (The Statuary Hall was established by Congress in 1864. Each state has 2 statues.)

While Father Damien and his canonization was a work in progress, he has been known and revered in the Church and by the people of Hawaii for over a century. Father Damien was canonized in 2009 by Pope Benedict XVI. His feast day is May 10.

[Part 1. Early Life, Before Hawaii] He was born Jozef de Veuster in Belgium in 1840. His early life passed on the family farm, which equipped him with a strong body, immense practical knowledge, and an industrious spirit. These endowments proved most beneficial in his later work. Jozef desired to be a priest since he was a child. He joined his older brother, Pamphile, already a member of the Congregation of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary. His superiors thought Jozef (i.e., Damien) lacked sufficient education for the priesthood, however, but through hard work and his brother’s help, he won their confidence. At his first vows, he received the name Damien, after an early Christian martyr. Though not yet ordained, he volunteered to go to the Hawaiian Islands in place of his brother, who fell sick with typhus. (<https://owlcation.com/humanities/St-Damien-of-Molokai-Beauty-or-Beast>)

[Part 2. Assignment to Missionary work in Hawaii] In May 1864, two months after arriving in his new mission, Damien was ordained a priest in Honolulu and assigned to the island of Hawaii. In 1873, he went to the Hawaiian government’s leper colony on the island of Molokai, set up seven years earlier. Part of a team of four chaplains taking that assignment for three months each year, Damien soon volunteered to remain permanently, caring for the people’s physical, medical and spiritual needs. In time, he became their most effective advocate to obtain promised government support.

Soon the settlement had new houses and a new church, school and orphanage.

Morale improved considerably. A few years later he succeeded in getting the Franciscan Sisters of Syracuse, led by Mother Marianne Cope (January 23), to help staff this colony in Kalaupapa. (Source: <https://www.crossroadsinitiative.com/media/articles/saint-damien-of-molokai/>)

[Part 3. Damien’s Illness, Leprosy, Death] From the beginning, Fr. Damien wanted the patients to understand that he was not afraid of them. As he wrote to his brother in Europe, “I make myself a leper with the lepers to gain all to Jesus Christ.” Indeed, he ate with them, dressed their sores, built coffins, churches, roads, a hospital, and organized their lives. He treated them with dignity and ministered to their spiritual needs until, after sixteen years, he succumbed to the disease. He died on April 15, 1889, aged 49. [Part 4. Father Damien Remembered] The Hawaiian princess and future queen Liliuokalani arrived at Molokai in 1881, eight years after Damien.

When Damien had arrived [in 1873] at the colony, it was popularly known as “the living graveyard.” The lepers suffered from almost every human need. Food, clean water, clothing, shelter, basic medical care – all were wanting on the island. They had been brought to Molokai simply to wait for death – and death’s stench was all around them.

[Between 1873 – 1881], Damien’s presence on the island had effected dramatic changes. A former farm boy with Martin Sheen good looks, Damian worked continuously for the lepers. He built houses, schools, and a conduit for freshwater, arranged for clothing to be delivered from the mainland, taught them to grow their own food. He advocated for them with the authorities and procured the medical supplies that would better their lives. He tended them, taught them, and, against medical advice, ate with them. All of this was accomplished even as he offered daily Mass and prayers, performed baptisms and marriages, and, of course, anointed the sick and said funerals for the dead.

[In 1881], the deformed faces of the children ... appeared before [Princess/Queen Liliuokalani] as well-fed, neatly dressed schoolgirls. They formed a choir that serenaded her with a few songs, an

expression of how far Damien had brought them in that short time. That day, the princess' tears flowed freely. She praised the lepers' courage, and when she returned home, she sent a letter to Father Damien, offering him the title of Commander of the Royal Order of Kalakaua, Hawaii's highest honor.

Belgian Cardinal Godfried Daneels famously said that Damien was no "porcelain saint." But porcelain is not even a substance of which saints can be made. Since Peter ate fish on the beach with his Resurrected Master, saints have been constructed of flesh and blood only – wounded and even treacherous flesh and blood, but flesh and blood all the same. And it is by this apparent coinherence of frailty and fullness that we find ourselves transfixed.

Early on, Damien began referring in his sermons to "we lepers." In the mouth of a handsome, healthy priest, it may have sounded like an attempt to mollify his little flock, propaganda to sway his constituents. In the mouth of the man that we see in pictures at the end, covered with the scaly, black sores of the disease [of leprosy], it takes on a different cast. And to hear this same man rejoice on his deathbed – "People pity me and think me unfortunate, but I think myself the happiest of missionaries" – this takes our breath away. This is why we still need Damien de Veuster.

Date of the Solemnity of Ascension

Transferred to Sunday May 29

The Bishops of New Jersey have permanently transferred the observance of the **Ascension of the Lord** to the following Sunday which is currently listed as the "7th Sunday of Easter."

In 2022, the Ascension of the Lord will be celebrated on Sunday, May 29, with its vigil on the evening of Saturday, May 28. (This is U.S. Memorial Day Weekend in 2022).

NOTE TO LECTORS: This means that the actual biblical readings at Sunday Mass on May 28-29 may now be found in your Lector's Workbook on pages 181-184 on the pages for "Ascension of the Lord." The Second Reading has 2 options. Please prepare both, just in case, the second option is selected. Readings for Mass, for the congregation will come from Gather #967.

On Thursday May 26, there will be 1 Morning Mass at 8:30 am celebrating the Memorial of St. Philip Neri.

2022-2023 REGISTRATION (Classes start September 2022)

FAMILY CATECHESIS - GRADES 1 - 5

Family Classes are on **Saturday afternoon 3:00 - 5:30pm** **OR** **Monday night 5:00 - 7:30pm** and selected Sunday mornings, including Sunday Mass, and meet **once a month**. Parent/Guardian must attend with child.

GRADE 6

Classes are on **Wednesday nights 6:30 - 7:30pm** and selected Sunday mornings*, including Sunday Mass, and meet **twice a month**.

MIDDLE/HIGH SCHOOL - GRADES 7 - 12

Classes are on **Monday night 7:00 - 8:30pm** and selected Sunday mornings 9:30 - 11:30am, including Sunday Mass. Classes meet **weekly**.

SACRAMENT PREPARATION - 2 year policy*

Children should begin Religious Education in Grade 1 to help them prepare for the **Sacraments of First Penance and First Communion** in the spring of Grade 2. It is required for a child to complete 2 years of Religious Education, regardless of their age/grade, before receiving these sacraments.



Preparation for the **Sacrament of Confirmation** is a 2 year process which begins in Grade 7 and celebrated in the fall of Grade 9.



***Estimated date for Sacraments may change due to actual attendance.**
***Parents in grades 6-12 are requested to attend the 1st and 2nd class on the schedule.**


