**MISSION STATEMENT** The people of God in West Orange were called by the Holy Spirit in 1914 to form Our Lady of Lourdes Parish, a community centered on Jesus Christ. The Holy Spirit remains with us today as we continue our journey to God. We are inspired by the Gospel of Jesus Christ, nourished by the Eucharist, called to respect life and proclaim our Catholic faith. We serve God by providing spiritual, educational, and social activities for our parish family as well as extending God's love and compassion to serve the greater community.



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ

On Palm Sunday, as recounted in Mark 14:1-15:47, a significant event unfolds with Jesus and his disciples. In this critical moment, despite the gravity of the situation, the disciples seem to struggle to stay awake while Jesus grapples with intense spiritual turmoil. Meanwhile, Judas Iscariot is active, betraying Jesus.

As they arrive at Gethsemane, a tranquil garden away from the chaos of the city and Judas' schemes, Jesus is deeply distressed, praying fervently for a way out, yet ultimately submitting to God's will. However, his disciples, seemingly oblivious to the gravity of the situation, repeatedly fall asleep.

This leads to three distinct responses or lessons from Jesus:

1. <u>**Telling</u>**: The first response is one of urgency. Jesus admonishes his disciples to wake up, recognizing their human frailty even as he acknowledges their willingness in spirit. Similarly, in our own lives, we may become spiritually lethargic due to disappointment or discouragement, but Jesus calls us to remain alert and engaged with him.</u>

2. <u>Tolerating</u>: The second time the disciples fall asleep, Jesus allows them to do so without reprimand. This response highlights the concept of tolerance in God's dealings with humanity. Despite our shortcomings and failures, God grants us free will and accepts our choices, even if they lead to injustice or wrongdoing. However, this tolerance is not a condoning of sin but rather an invitation to repentance and the possibility of redemption.

3. <u>Turning Back</u>: Despite the disciples' repeated failures, Jesus does not give up on them. Instead, he urges them to "turn back" and continue on the journey with him. This illustrates God's relentless love and commitment to us, always inviting us to return to him regardless of our past mistakes.

Just as Jesus invited his disciples to accompany him on the journey to the Cross, he invites us to walk with him, offering forgiveness and a fresh start. In essence, Jesus' responses to his disciples' behavior on that fateful night reflect his ongoing relationship with you and me. Both you and I are called to wakefulness and engagement, tolerates our imperfections while still urging us to repentance, and never gives up on us despite our repeated failures. Ultimately, his message is one of hope and redemption, inviting us to rise and continue the journey with him, a journey that is not just taking place in church, but on your school bus, in your car, in your home. I pray that you, our young people, will stay close to God during upcoming Spring Break and other school vacations!

After each of our falls – one, two, three or more – he invites us not simply by telling, not simply by tolerating that everything we do is OK, but by urging us to walk with him, with turning back to us. He does not give up on us, but tells you and me "to rise, let us be going [on our way]". (Mark 14:42)


