Dear Brothers & Sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes

Part 1 of 2 "Rule of Saint Benedict" and our Everyday Lives An Introduction to "The Vows" and "Hospitality"

I share with you this reflection on saints and the spiritual life, based on the Rule of Saint Benedict whose feast day is July 11. Guiding principles for the sisters and brothers of the Benedictine order are included in the rule. These same principles can apply to our spiritual life.

The Rule of St. Benedict is a timeless document - in so many ways as fresh and relevant as it was when it was written almost fifteen hundred years ago. Although written for monastics, many of the issues addressed in the Rule can be applied to life in the world outside the monastic community. The qualities which make up a valued life - humility, patience, simplicity, solitude, caring for others, and living in community - concern everyone. These specifics of the Rule, and the framework it provides, have great meaning for people who are seeking to live out their faith in the world today.

The Rule offers people a plan for living a balanced, simple, and prayerful life.

The Rule of Benedict (RB) constitutes a basic guide for living the Christian life and continues to be followed by every Benedictine monastery and convent in the world today. Just the idea that a guide for living could not only last 1500 years, but continue to be followed by thousands of people makes its study valuable for monks and nuns as well as laypeople.

The Vows

In the Rule, Benedict tells his monks and nuns that a balance of prayer, work, study, and leisure (renewal) is their way, that the Divine Office is their work (Opus Dei), and the vows of stability, conversion, and obedience are their commitments. These vows have much to say to those of us not living in a monastery or convent.

In a commentary on the vows, Sister JM McClure, O.S.B. wrote:

Benedictines make three vows: stability, fidelity to the monastic way of life, and obedience. Though promises of poverty and chastity are implied in the Benedictine way, stability, fidelity, and obedience receive primary attention in the Rule – perhaps because of their close relationship with community life. Stability means that the monastic pledges lifelong commitment to a particular community. To limit oneself voluntarily to one place with one group of people for the rest of one's life makes a powerful statement. Contentment and fulfilment do not exist in constant change; true happiness cannot necessarily be found anywhere other than in this place and this time. For Benedictines, the vow of stability proclaims rootedness, 'at-homeness', that this place and this monastic family will endure.

"Let everyone that comes be received as Christ" is one of the most familiar and oft-quoted phrases of the Rule. It emphasizes the preeminent position which hospitality occupies in every Benedictine monastery. Benedictine hospitality goes beyond the exercise of the expected social graces – the superficial smile or the warm reception of expected guests. Hospitality for Benedict meant that everyone who comes – the poor, the traveler, the curious, those not of our religion or social standing or education – should be received with genuine acceptance.

Vatican announces theme for World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly to be held on JULY 28th

The Catholic Church celebrates the "World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly" each year on the Sunday closest to the feast of Saints Joachim and Anne, Jesus' grandparents.

Pope Francis has chosen a line from Psalm 71 — "Do not cast me off in my old age" — as the theme for the 2024 celebration of the World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly.



In a note announcing the

theme for the day, the Vatican said the choice was "meant to call attention to the fact that, sadly, loneliness is the bitter lot in life of many elderly persons, often the victims of the throwaway culture."

"Our communities, with their tenderness and affectionate attention that does not forget its most fragile members, are called to manifest the love of God, who never abandons anyone," the cardinal said.




