Healing of Soul and Body

Pope Benedict XVI compared going to church to visiting the doctor: in both places, we seek life that is fuller and healthier. We turn to physical and spiritual "medicine" because we are concerned about life, death, and well-being (Benedict XVI, p. 243). Just as we share our symptoms with doctors to receive the best care, we must reveal our sins to Christ, our spiritual healer, to be fully restored. Confession, like a doctor's visit, requires honesty, but with Jesus, there's no copay or appointment needed.

Spiritual Healing

Jesus, our Good Shepherd, is the ultimate physician of both body and soul. He came so that we "might have life and have it more abundantly (John 10:10). For spiritual healing, we must disclose our faults, much like when we consult a doctor. In confession, Jesus, through the priest, heals us. There's no need for an appointment—your healing is always available.

Death

Pope Benedict XVI also noted that anyone who cares for human life, like first responders and healthcare workers, inevitably faces death (Benedict XVI, *Dogma and Preaching*, p. 243). Firefighters, EMS, and police know that protecting life often means risking their own. Their heroism, like that of the 9/11 first responders, exemplifies the ultimate sacrifice in service to others.

Sign of the Cross

On Ash Wednesday, we receive ashes in the shape of the cross, a sign that echoes the blessing we received at baptism. This sign, given to us at birth and spoken over us at death, serves as a reminder that life is a journey between these two moments—a mid-life commitment to carry the cross of Christ throughout our lives.

Baptism

Pope Benedict XVI emphasized that "being a Christian" is a daily process of "becoming a Christian" (Benedict XVI, p. 287). We are not simply upgrading to a new version of ourselves but living out our vocations anew each day. Like a firefighter who continuously recommits to their mission, we renew our call to be disciples, spouses, parents, and

neighbors in community, never in isolation. Our baptism, though personal, connects us to the whole Church and the world.

Saving Your Life

Recently, I heard some "life saving advice". This was from an example given at a Catholic seminar and the speaker is the leader of a group called the Catholic Roundtable for Church Leadership. Her name is Kerry Robinson. She was speaking to clergy, religious, and Catholic church faithful parishioners with a reminder that good discipleship and decision making is rooted in the Gospel good news about both life and death.

The prayer – the fasting – the almsgiving – of Lent are meant to remind us to love God and neighbor as much as we love ourselves. And, we do these things because Christ himself once did them for 40 days, in preparation for his own living and dying.

Kerry Robinson shared a Q&A discussion she had with other Catholic leaders at which everyone was asked: "how would you like to die?"

The responses were diverse, from each person – each of whom was a fully grown adult:

"I would like to die in my sleep."

"I would like to die without pain, without having to suffer or be a burden to my family"

"I would like to die after having the opportunity to say good bye to my loved ones".

Then, Kerry Robinson's town teenage daughter — who happened to be in the room — was asked her opinion. She responded:

"I would like to die in the process of saving someone else's life"

We receive the Gospel and the sign of the cross ourselves in the hope of following Christ by whom our lives were saved. He called us to follow him not just with an inscription on our head but also with his words in hearts, that "he who lays down his life for my sake will save it." Repent and believe in the Gospel.




