Dear Brothers & Sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes, The Container Store

Earthen vessels are the places in which we keep all of our valuables, according to Paul's famous phrase. (2 Corinthians 4:7) Such a category of storage will remind us of clay pots, terra cotta vases, and other materials. Are these sturdy enough for your or my treasured objects?

We might prefer a steel vault or something with an alphanumeric PIN. While knowing nothing about cloud storage, Paul was acknowledging that we all want to have a backup. We all want security. Is this however, for purchase or negotiation?

In the Gospel, the brothers, James and John, are at the front desk, anticipating "checkout" or an "upgrade" with such a question and negotation. They have heard about a Kingdom and the positive reviews. They want to arrange a place for themselves. They have a shopping cart full of desire for status in the new *status quo*.

In fact, they are correct about the latter. The Kingdom will bring new conditions and circumstances and require new competency. They are mistaken in asking for a title. Jesus sends a message, "Can you drink the chalice that I am going to drink?" (Matthew 20:22) In unison, they click [OK]. Do they even understand the commands of the program in the new Kingdom? They still think they are shopping for storage and/or seating, maybe a personal seat license and season tickets.

James and John do not want the clay of the earth. They want a new hardwood floor above the earth and comfy chairs in heaven. Crate and Barrel?

Jesus responds that such an eternal-life-time guarantee is not his to give in the middle of life. James and John are asked – as you and I are asked – will we testify to the new life we experience now even in earthen and fragile vessels? That is, are we not able to rejoice for the gifts which God has given us, the forgiveness and wisdom shared with us, even amid our own uncertain circumstances.

We are called not to ask for guarantees but to ask for assistance, not to ask for ease and convenience but rather encouragement and companionship in our prayers and petitions. In this way, Jesus does want to help and assist us on our way to his Kingdom and to help us to be secure in his love.
