Dear Brothers & Sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes,

This reflection is based on the Gospel and my homily of 13 October and the 28th Sunday of the year.

Title: 10 Percent, 10 Commandments**

In the Gospel of the Rich Young Man, a man of some prestige asks Jesus the ultimate question: "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" Although he claims to have followed the Commandments and to heed the call to follow Jesus, he leaves "shocked" and "grieving" when Jesus challenges him. This raises the question: How hard is it to truly follow Christ? Let's explore this by considering:

Man in the Top 10 Percent

God's Word in 10 Commandments

Our call to give the first 10 percent

[Man in Top 10%] The man in the Gospel is known as the "rich young man" or "rich young ruler." Can we also consider ourselves "rich"? Richness isn't just about wealth—it could mean being highly educated, well-connected, or powerful. This man has many possessions, but how much does that really matter?

A study I came across revealed that 90% of business managers believe they perform in the top 10%, highlighting a common tendency to overestimate our abilities. I, too, can sometimes fall into this trap, thinking that when things go wrong, others are to blame. I relate to this Gospel—do we perceive ourselves as faithful followers of Christ based solely on our "performance"?

The rich young man likely knew the importance of repentance and following the law. However, even this focus can become materialistic or self-righteous. He sees himself in the top 10 percent.

[God's Word in 10 Commandments] God's Word is given to us in the 10 Commandments. The rich man in the Gospel prides himself on following these Commandments. When Moses received the Commandments on two stone tablets, the first tablet contained commandments focused on loving God:

- 1. Thou shalt have no other gods before me.
- 2. Thou shalt not take the Lord's name in vain.
- 3. Keep holy the Sabbath day.

The second tablet, which the rich young man excelled in observing, includes commandments about loving one's neighbor, such as honoring one's parents, not killing, and not stealing.

Jesus challenges the young man on the first three commandments, which focus on love of God. The issue is not just avoiding penalties for breaking the rules but asking: do you love God with all your heart?

We often follow laws primarily to avoid punishment or fines. For example, we don't lie, cheat, or steal not just because it's wrong, but because we fear the consequences. But is that the only reason we follow the commandments?

Jesus reminds us that all commandments are about love—especially love of God. Consider ethical principles like the protection of life—whether the life of an unborn child or a stranger. Jesus said, "The kingdom of God belongs to such as these." Our love for the vulnerable flows from recognizing that life belongs to God. Even those who don't believe in God can still show love for others, but our motivation is rooted in recognizing God as the Creator of all life.

Jesus challenges the rich young man to see that the commandments are not just a path to personal success but are about protecting human life and respecting the God-given dignity of every person. Laws in society protect us, but God's law affirms our worth. All the commandments come down to loving God and loving our neighbor as ourselves.

[Our Call to Give the First 10%] The rich young man, having followed the commandments, is then asked by Jesus to give up his material possessions. This reminds me of a principle: we are called to give our first 10 percent to God.

In tithing, this means giving 10% of our income to charity. But it could also mean giving the first 10% of our day to God in prayer. If we spend about two hours getting ready in the morning, can we give 12 minutes — a mere 10% of that time — to prayer? Often, we can give more, but how about a minimum of 12 minutes each day?

In our relationships, can we also give the first 10% of our time and attention to our loved ones? By dedicating this time, we learn to adore God, rather than ourselves.

Thomas Merton, in an essay (Prologue, *No Man Is An Island* book) also emphasizes the importance of loving

asked to give up his possessions because true change begins with generosity. When we love others, we can more easily accept our own limitations.

Maybe I'm not in the top 10% in performance, but I can live with that because I know I am loved by God. Our worth transcends any statistics or achievements. As long as we secretly adore ourselves, our flaws will haunt us, and we'll never be satisfied. But if we love others and live for them, we realize that no one expects us to be "God."

Our imperfections can lead us closer to God.

Do you want to be in the top 10%? Or have 10% more wealth or success? Jesus warns that such desires can pull us away from God, just as they did for King David. Despite his wealth as king, David fell into sin and needed God's mercy. He prayed in Psalm 51: "Have mercy on me, O God, in your kindness; in your compassion, blot out my offense."

This Psalm and the Gospel remind us that nothing is impossible with God. Our true greatness comes not from material success, but from seeking God's help with a humble and contrite heart: "A humble, contrite heart, O God, you will not spurn." This humility and prayer connect us to God, giving us the hope of eternal life.


