We are inspired by the Gospel of Jesus Christ, nourished by the Eucharist, called to respect life and proclaim our Catholic faith. We serve God by providing spiritual, educational, and social activities for our parish family as well as extending God's love and compassion to serve the greater community.



Dear Brothers & Sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes,

In the Church's liturgical year, which started during Advent, we are reading continuously on most Sundays from the Gospel of Luke, because we are in Year C of the 3-year cycle. (Year A is Matthew; Year B is Mark; the Gospel of John is read on selected Sundays and Holy Days in all 3 years)

This Sunday is from Luke chapter 1 & chapter 4.

The Gospel of Luke: Addressed to the Beloved of God

Luke, one of the four Gospel writers, presents his Gospel in the form of a letter addressed to "Theophilus," meaning "beloved of God." This Gospel is not only for Theophilus but for all of us, emphasizing both *who we are* — beloved of God — and *what we are*. Luke aims to provide certainty about Jesus' teachings in an orderly sequence, inviting us to reflect on our roles in God's plan.

<u>Understanding "Who We Are" vs. "What We Are"</u>

A college roommate of mine once didn't know my last name, despite sharing a living space. While humorous in retrospect, at the time it felt like a dismissal of my identity. This small experience highlights the distinction between *who we are* (individuals with names and dignity) and *what we are* (roles or functions).

Similarly, St. Paul, in his first letter to the Corinthians, stresses the importance of every part of the body of Christ. Regardless of how insignificant we may feel, we all contribute to the health and functioning of the whole body. Just as we exercise not for individual parts but for the whole body, our participation in the church community reflects our unity as the Body of Christ.

Roles in the Church Community

Our parish is blessed by the service of religious education catechists and aides, lectors, ushers, and altar servers and many volunteers who actively contribute to our mission. Yet, every one of you, whether present at Mass or participating from home, plays a vital role. You might not stand at the lectern or usher at the door, but you carry responsibility as an ambassador for Christ wherever you are.

Your prayers, charitable contributions, and presence in the community — no matter how hidden — are invaluable. This collective effort reflects the unity of the Body of Christ, where every member is essential.

Recognizing the Sanctity of Life

The Gospel challenges us to uphold the sanctity of life, recognizing *what* a person is—a unique and sacred creation. Jesuit Father Robert Spitzer writes that while *who* a person is may be intangible, *what* they are is clear. Science and faith affirm the dignity of life from conception, revealing the unity between mother and child in the womb.

This understanding of human dignity extends beyond identity or ideology. It is not dependent on external labels but rooted in our shared nature as humans created in God's image.

Mercy and Compassion

While divisions and challenges exist, God's mercy is ever-present. For those touched by the tragedy of abortion or other struggles, repentance opens the door to God's boundless absolution. Mercy and compassion are not just attributes of God—they define who and what God is.

United as One Body

We are many parts but one body. Our dignity and worth stem from both *who we are* and *what we are*. Let us remember our shared identity as the beloved of God and our responsibility to reflect this love in our lives, actions, and relationships.
