Dear Brothers & Sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes,

We are approaching the season of Lent which begins with Ash Wednesday March 5.

Ashes will be distributed at each every Mass and prayer service on that day, scheduled for: 7 am (service), 8:30 am (Morning Mass), 12 Noon (service), 3:30 pm (service), 5:30 pm (service), 7 pm (service).

I share with my homily of the 6<sup>th</sup> Sunday (February 16) as a reflection on the Beatitudes and the direction which Jesus is calling us. The 40 Days of Lent are also about a direction for our lives.

#### The Beatitudes / Redirection / Lent

[**Introduction**] The Beatitudes (Luke 6:17, 20-26) challenge our understanding of what it means to be blessed: "Blessed are the poor, blessed are those who mourn...." At first glance, these states seem undesirable, something we naturally resist. Yet, Jesus presents them not as circumstances to escape but as a way to navigate life spiritually.

Jesus delivers this message in two different settings—on the mount (Matthew) and the plain (Luke). This contrast symbolizes movement, a call to change direction and embrace an unexpected path. Whether Jesus is speaking from an elevated position or descending to the plain, His message remains the same: the Beatitudes are not simply moral teachings but an invitation to a new way of life.

How do we know if we are headed in the right direction?

[Direction and Navigation] A few years ago, I traveled to Atlanta, Georgia, for a family funeral. My uncle had passed away, and my family, scattered across different states, made their way to the city in their own ways. I flew in alone, rented a car, and thought I could easily navigate my way. After all, I had been there before—even in a time before GPS.

However, as I neared my destination, my GPS signal weakened until it was completely lost. I was left in the dark—literally, as it was nighttime, and the roads were empty. I was unfamiliar with the neighborhood and unable to rely on technology.

In that moment, I had to depend on someone else. My brother, who had driven the same roads a few hours earlier, guided me over the phone. Step by step, he helped me navigate, and I arrived safely. The journey taught me a lesson in trust—relying not only on technology but on another person's voice.

**Depending on God**] Do I trust God's voice in the same way? Do I listen to His guidance through Scripture, prayer, and the wisdom of others? Do you?

Psalm 119 says, "God's word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path." The Beatitudes serve as this guiding

light. They direct us toward God's kingdom though their path may be one we would not have chosen.

[**Cautions from the Gospel**] Life is full of directions and limits. Speed limits, for example, are often seen as restrictions we might not want to follow. Yet, they exist for our safety.

Similarly, Jesus presents the Beatitudes with both promises and warnings: "Woe to you who are rich now... Woe to you who laugh now." At first, this might seem confusing. Does Jesus want us to be poor and sorrowful? No. But He wants us to recognize that wealth and comfort can be distractions if they distance us from God.

We see public examples of this all the time-celebrities who gain everything the world offers but still find themselves lost. Money, fame, and pleasure are not inherently bad, but when they become our sole focus, they can lead us astray. On the other hand, poverty, mourning, and humility can be blessings when they draw us closer to God. The Beatitudes are our spiritual GPS-guiding us toward a life centered on God rather than temporary gains.

[Virtue in Poverty, Sorrow] I think of my grandparents, who immigrated to this country in the early 1900s with little to their name. They lived simply, even when they eventually became more financially stable. They had one closet in an apartment for five people. Yet, they never measured their lives by their possessions.

Their poverty taught them not just the value of a dollar, but the value of everything. In the same way, mourning teaches us not just the value of the person who has died, the value of everyone's life, the value of our own lives. Sorrow can open our hearts to a greater appreciation of life and a deeper connection to God.

**Redirection**] Jesus' message in the Beatitudes is not about deprivation for its own sake. It is about reorienting our priorities. We all experience poverty in some form—whether material, emotional, or spiritual. In those moments, we are reminded of our need for God.

Personally, I often want things done my way, on my timeline. When plans change or things don't go as expected, I can become frustrated. But these moments remind me that my own "GPS" is flawed. I need God's guidance, not just my own.

Jesus calls us to follow Him, to embrace simplicity and humility, and to trust in His direction—even when the road seems uncertain. The kingdom of God is found in this journey

#### .[Introduction to Ash Wednesday: Fasting and Prayer]

Would it not be better for us to recognize our limitations and entrust ourselves to God's wisdom?

At times, darkness—whether literal or spiritual—can be a blessing. It forces us to seek light beyond ourselves. When we acknowledge our vulnerability, we create space for God to lead us.

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday – March 5<sup>th</sup> - a time to reflect on our spiritual journey. The ashes remind us of our mortality and dependence on God. Fasting and prayer help us refocus, not just by giving something up, but by making room for something greater.

Fasting is not just about food—it is about letting go of distractions. It is about fasting from unnecessary worries, from excessive speech about our problems, and from self-reliance. When we fast, we open ourselves to deeper listening—both to God and to those around us.

Are you – am I - going in the right direction? The Beatitudes invite us to look for God's presence in unexpected places – in poverty, in sorrow, in humility. Let us follow Jesus down this road of simplicity and trust. The kingdom of God is found there.

#### St. Vincent DePaul Society


