Dear Brothers and Sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes,

I share with you my homily for May 22: Saint Rita of Cascia.

Today is the Memorial of Saint Rita of Cascia, an Augustinian nun, born Margarita Lotti in Italy in the 1300s. She eventually joined the Augustinian order, but her path to religious life was long and marked by suffering, perseverance, and, most of all, love—the kind of love that Jesus speaks about in John 14.

In today's Gospel, Jesus says, "If you love me, keep my commandments." This isn't always easy, especially when the commandment is to love everyone—not just the people who are kind to us, but also those who are unkind or even hostile. When we think of love, we tend to think of our family, our friends, the people who are naturally closest to us. But Jesus stretches the command: "Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you."

These are tall orders. And often, our "enemy" isn't a distant stranger or someone in a faraway place—it may be someone very close to us. It could be someone who is opposing us, someone doing something wrong or hurtful, someone making our lives difficult. Yet Jesus calls us to love them too. This is the love of the Gospel: not conditional, not easy, not convenient—but transformative.

Saint Rita's life embodies this Gospel love.

She grew up desiring to become a religious sister, but her parents arranged a marriage for her when she was still a teenager. Her husband, Paolo Mancini, was a harsh and abusive man. Yet, like * Saint Monica — another great Augustinian figure, the mother of Saint Augustine—Rita did not give up. She prayed fervently for her husband's conversion. And by the grace of God, he did convert. His heart softened. He changed his ways.

Tragically, Paolo was murdered, caught in a cycle of violence and revenge. His death left Rita with two sons, and her sorrow deepened when she learned that they intended to avenge their father's murder. This, of

course, was the culture at the time—it was "La Vendet-ta." Rita feared not only for their souls but also for the consequences they would face if they went through with their plan.

So she prayed again — this time, even more desperately. She asked God to stop them, to intervene, to preserve them from sin. And in a way only God could allow, both of her sons died during a plague before they could carry out the act of revenge. Tragic, yes — but also, in a strange and painful way, merciful.

Now alone, Rita sought again to fulfill her original calling. She entered the monastery and became an Augustinian sister. From that point on, her life was marked by prayer, penance, and peacemaking. Today, she is known as the patron saint of troubled marriages, difficult relationships, family trials, and impossible causes.

And rightly so. Her life was filled with circumstances that seemed impossible: loving an abusive spouse, losing her entire family, and choosing peace in the midst of a culture of revenge. Yet she remained faithful to Jesus' command: "If you love me, keep my commandments."

I first encountered Saint Rita during my time in the seminary. I remember being at a crossroads—wrestling with doubts about my vocation and wondering what direction God was calling me to take. I wasn't planning to leave the seminary altogether, but I was thinking seriously about changing paths—perhaps joining a religious order, perhaps exploring the Augustinians, whose life and mission I admired.

During a retreat at an Augustinian monastery near Villanova University in Pennsylvania,. I remember saying to the retreat director, "I really like the community here. Could I join this community?" And that moment opened up a whole new line of thought for me.

It also taught me something important about vocation. When we see someone discerning a vocation, we shouldn't just ask them, "Do you want to be a priest?" or "Do you want to be a religious sister?" There's so much more richness to explore. What kind of priest?

What kind of sister? What kinds of ministries are possible? There are teachers, scholars, missionaries, hospital chaplains—so many paths.

At that time, I was interested in the life and spirit of the Augustinians. I was inspired by their charism and their mission. Honestly, I think I was also a little bored with my own seminary experience, and maybe the grass seemed greener on the other side.

But had I gone that route, I wouldn't be here now. My life would have unfolded very differently. And I don't regret the path I chose.

During that same retreat, the spiritual director said something to me to encourage me:, "Jim, you will be a blessing" It was something I needed to hear and retain. I don't always feel like a blessing, but that moment of affirmation stuck with me. It still does.

And this retreat director (Father Jim McBurney, OSA) noted I would be ordained a deacon on May 22, the feast day of Saint Rita, an Augustinian.

Saint Rita's life teaches us how to remain in the Father's love, even in the darkest and most difficult of situations. She teaches us that to love like Jesus is to love even when it's hard—to love those who don't love us back, to forgive when it seems impossible, to trust when hope feels lost.

She reminds us that there are no truly "impossible causes" with God.

So on this day, as we reflect on Saint Rita's life and listen again to Jesus' words in John 14—"If you love me, keep my commandments"—let's pray for the courage to love like Rita. To persevere like Rita. To trust like Rita.

And let's ask her intercession for all those in our lives who are going through difficult marriages, broken families, or vocational uncertainty. May they, too, discover the grace to love and to persevere—just as she did.

Saint Rita of Cascia, pray for us. Amen.


