MISSION STATEMENT The people of God in West Orange were called by the Holy Spirit in 1914 to form Our Lady of Lourdes Parish, a community centered on Jesus Christ. The Holy Spirit remains with us today as we continue our journey to God. We are inspired by the Gospel of Jesus Christ, nourished by the Eucharist, called to respect life and proclaim our Catholic faith. We serve God by providing spiritual, educational, and social activities for our parish family as well as extending God's love and compassion to serve the greater community.



Dear Brothers and Sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes,

1. Jesus' Lesson Plan: Sacrifice, Humility, and Love Tonight we begin the sacred Triduum—Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter. Together, these days form the great lesson plan of Jesus. And like any good teacher, Jesus doesn't just speak in words—He teaches with His life.

Tonight at the table with His disciples, Jesus isn't just sharing a meal. He's preparing them for something far deeper: a lesson of sacrifice, humility, and divine love.

But even after years with Jesus, the disciples struggled to understand. He told them 3 times He would suffer and die, and each time they resisted or misunderstood. Peter tried to stop Him. James and John asked for places of honor. The others argued about who was the greatest. They were hearing the words, but not grasping the meaning.

Are we really so different? Don't we also need continuing formation in humility and love?

2. From the First Passover to the Last Supper

Our first reading takes us back to the first Passover. The Israelites, enslaved in Egypt, were told to prepare a lamb, mark their doors with its blood, and be ready to leave at a moment's notice. It was both a meal and a movement—a shared act of faith, obedience, and liberation.

If one household was too small for a lamb, they joined with another. Passover was never meant to be private—it was communal. The lamb gave its life to sustain and sanctify the people.

This sets the stage for tonight. At the Last Supper, Jesus becomes the new Passover Lamb. He gives His body and blood for the life of the world. His sacrifice would no longer be just for one people or one night—but for all, for all time.

And just as God saved Israel from death through the blood of a lamb, so now God saves the world through the blood of Christ.

3. Do This in Memory of Me

At the table, Jesus says: "Do this in memory of me." These words aren't just a suggestion. They are a command, and they are a gift.

Jesus institutes the Eucharist – not merely as a symbol, but as real spiritual nourishment. "This is my body, given for you. This is my blood, poured out for you."

He also ordains His disciples to carry on this sacred act. From the beginning, the Eucharist has been the heart of our Church, the place where heaven and earth meet.

Every time we gather at this altar, we don't just remember. We participate in the one eternal sacrifice of Christ. We are nourished by His very presence.

And we prepare this table not only for ourselves, but for the children who will one day receive First Communion—for the future Church. Just as others prepared it for us.

4. The Master Who Serves

But before giving His body and blood, Jesus does something extraordinary. He kneels and washes His disciples' feet.

This act of humility shocks them. Peter even resists. But Jesus insists: "If I do not wash you, you have no part in me."

In a world that prizes status, power, and appearance, Jesus turns everything upside down. The Master becomes the servant.

And He tells them—and us—"As I have done for you, so must you do for one another."

This foot washing is not just a ritual. It's a commission. Every time we serve each other in love—especially when it's uncomfortable or difficult—we carry on Christ's mission.

5. Vulnerability and Redemptive Love

Jesus knows what awaits Him. He is not caught off guard. He walks willingly toward the cross—not because He enjoys suffering, but because love makes suffering meaningful.

Unlike the lambs of old or the victims of injustice today, Jesus *chooses* to offer His life. In doing so, He redefines vulnerability — not as weakness, but as strength. As redemptive power.

And even as He is betrayed, arrested, and crucified, His response is love:

"Forgive them, Father, they know not what they do."
"Today, you will be with me in Paradise."

These are not just words from the past. They are words for us today.

6. A Call to Love and Forgive

Tonight, we are invited to imitate Christ's humility, sacrifice, and forgiveness.

Is there someone you struggle to love? Someone you find difficult to forgive?

Let tonight be a turning point. Let Holy Week soften our hearts.

As Jesus told Martha and Mary, "Only one thing is necessary." That one thing is love. Love gives suffering meaning. Love makes forgiveness possible. Love turns ordinary bread and wine into the very body and blood of Christ.


