Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

"Even though I walk in the valley of the shadow of death, I fear no evil." (Psalm 23:4)

The intervals of valley and mountain, of downhill and uphill, can help us in cardiovascular exercise. However, once we start a journey, I think we would prefer smooth and flat surfaces to the uncertain inclines and declines.

And, in the Advent biblical readings and Gospel, we read that our Savior also wishes to provide for us with the smooth and the flat. "Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain." (Isaiah 40:4)

What is your mountain? What is my incline or decline? What is our valley?

Pope Francis (General Audience, 27 November 2013) reminds us that the steep slope of mortality is made a plain – a smooth surface – through the Passion, Death and Resurrection of our Savior. As we read in the 1st letter of Peter: "For Christ also died for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, that he might bring us to God." (1 Peter 3:18)

When we are grieving or in sorrow, we may find it very difficult to reach out to someone in need. However, these acts of charity also help us to find the level plain and playing field. We walk a path toward God also by loving our neighbor and by

helping the person who may be fragile or marginalized or in need. We come closer to salvation through our charity to these individuals because Jesus identified himself with them:

"I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you clothed me, I was sick and you visited me, I was in prison and you came to me... 'as you did it to one of the least of these my brethren, you did it to me'" (Matthew 25:35-36, 40).

Pope Francis challenges you and me with the works of mercy, not only to sustain those we serve but also to save our own souls and rise to a new altitude of love and mercy. The Pope writes:

"The one who practices mercy does not fear death. And why does he not fear it? Because he looks death in the face in the wounds of his brothers and sisters, and he overcomes it with the love of Jesus Christ.

If we will open the door of our lives and hearts to our littlest brothers and sisters, then even our own death will become a door that introduces us to heaven, to the blessed homeland, toward which we are directed, longing to dwell forever with God our Father, with Jesus, with Our Lady and with the Saints." (Francis, General Audience, 27 November 2013, n. 3)
